

# DormSmart's Dorm Room Checklist


## What To Bring To College & How To Pack In Three Easy Steps

Our Dorm Room Checklist includes the essentials necessary for campus living plus a few tasks for college bound students to complete prior to move-in day! While this may seem like a lot to pack, many items suggested are dorm sized and easily stored, leaving room to spare!

**Step One:** Print DormSmart's Free Dorm Room Checklist. (Tip: Use our online Campus Housing Connector to check your school housing info and make any necessary adjustments to your checklist.)

**Step Two:** Make room in your home to store your college dorm essentials as you acquire them. (Tip: Save money, pack the items you have at home first. For items you must buy, shop early to give yourself time to check purchases, make returns.)

**Step Three:** Inventory as you pack quick and easy. For example, if you pack sheets in Box #1, write Box #1 next to that item on your checklist. (Tip: Use your dorm room checklist as an inventory for your College Property Insurance Policy.)

	Cleaning Products (Don't forget to bring a few old cleaning rags from home.)	
	Toilet Brush (Only necessary if you have an in-suite bathroom.) - CHECK WITH ROOMMATE

	Laptop (Get compatibility requirements from your school.)

	Laptop Bag / Book bag (Purchase a bag that will hold both your school supplies & laptop.)	
	UL Listed Surge Protectors w / Overload Protection (For appliances too. Flat plugs save space.)	
	Small Printer with Cable (Optional but great for procrastinators!) - CHECK WITH ROOMMATE	
	Ink & Paper for Printer (Optional) - CHECK WITH ROOMMATE

	3M Command Strips for hanging wall decor (Save your dorm deposit!)	
	Wall Decor (Removable & reusable wall decals look great & save your deposit!)

	Alarm Clock (Multipurpose... consider using the alarm on your cell phone.)	
	Portable Music Player	
	Small TV/DVD Combo - CHECK WITH ROOMMATE	
	Noise Canceling Headphones for TV/DVD Combo & Portable Music Player (Dorms can be noisy.)	
	Cable Splitter (In case you don't want to share a TV/DVD Player with your roommate.)	
	Extra Cable (You may need extra cable depending upon where the cable outlet is located.)	
	Extension Cords (Flat plugs save space.)	
	Phone / Answering System (DECT 6.0 prevents wireless interference.) - CHECK WITH ROOMMATE	
	Air Cleaner (Optional, consider filter free.) - CHECK WITH ROOMMATE	
	Fan (Optional) - CHECK WITH ROOMMATE	
	Pest Control (Optional, but strongly suggested.) - CHECK WITH ROOMMATE	
	Desk Lamp	
	Bedside Table Lamp	
	Removable Tap Lights for closet, if needed.

	Comfortable Desk Chair (Check with your school first.)	
	Folding Table (Optional. If you plan to host study sessions, movie nights, dinners, or game nights in your dorm room, pick up a compact folding picnic table like those made by Picnic Time. They work for both indoor & outdoor activities. Their compact design makes for easy transport & dorm room storage. Don't forget your playing cards!)

	UL Listed 3-Way Auto Shutoff Iron - CHECK WITH ROOMMATE

	Folding Clothing Dry Rack (Great for drying sweaters or fine washables.)	
	Sweater / Delicates Wash Bag Set (Take care of your clothes & you'll save money in the end!)	
	Laundry Staples (i.e. detergent, softener or dryer balls, color bleach, stain remover, starch...)

	Pop-up / Folding Hamper (2 keeps wet towels off clothes) OR a Sort-A-Sack Laundry Backpack

	Bed Risers (Check inside dimensions. Square shape works best for dorm bed posts.)	
	Hanging Storage for closet. (Check your closet dimensions before purchasing organizers.)	
	Storage Caddies (Optional. Store school supplies, hair appliances, makeup... everything!)	
	Storage Hooks for dorm room closet door. (Holds book bags, purses, jackets, wet towels...)	
	Space Bags (Optional. Save space by minimizing bulky clothing or blankets when not in use.)	
	Clothing Bag (Optional. Store your business suit. Take one professional outfit for special activities.)

	Bicycle (Bring an inexpensive bicycle to get around on or near campus. Don't forget your helmet & bike lock. A plastic shopping bag tied over the seat when not in use keeps your butt dry on those rainy days. A basket is great for holding your book bag or purchases too. If you are a DIYer, bring a tire patch kit & small air pump. If not, there is probably a bicycle repair shop near your college campus.)

	Register your bicycle.	
	If taking a vehicle, remember to register your vehicle with your school & get a parking permit.	
	Pack a few cool weather items such as a coat, jacket... Cool days happen in the summer & early fall!	
	Equipment for activities (i.e. music, sports, cheerleading...)	
	YOUR CLOTHES! Make a list of everything you'll need first then pack them up! (Remember... if your campus has a recreational facility, you need to bring your workout clothes, swimsuit, & a beach towel. Don't pack expensive jewelry.)	
	Luggage for travel over school breaks.	
	You may want to pack a small air mattress & extra blanket or sleeping bag for overnight company.	

	<b>Moving Your Dorm Stuff</b>	<b>Box #</b>
	If needed, reserve your moving trailer / transport early!	
	Purchase moving supplies such as boxes, packaging materials, tape, & a sharpie marker.	

### **Live DormSmart Moving To Campus Tip:**

Move-in weekend is BUSY! There are thousands of boxes arriving on campus and many students trying to locate misplaced items. If possible, it is best to purchase supplies early... pack them up in an orderly fashion... then accompany those supplies to your college campus / dorm room. If you do ship your college dorm supplies to your campus, just remember to use your campus ship to address and give yourself ample time to locate your dorm supplies.

Bottom line... you need as much time as possible to get settled into your dorm room on move-in weekend while participating in all the mandatory activities. So be smart, allow your family to help you get organized and settled. It will make the transition to college life much easier for everyone!
